

The two routes to Open Access (OA)

Green Open Access

- Deposit of author's accepted manuscript version in a repository.
- Individual self-archiving policies by publisher/journal.
- Embargo periods may apply.



Gold Open Access

 Fully OA journals and Hybrid OA option for subscription-based journals.



- OA content is freely available for anyone at anytime in exchange of a publication charge.
- Gold OA removes
 permission barriers
 (most copyright and license restrictions).

Deposit of authors accepted manuscript version (AAM):

- Author's own website: no embargo/immediately
- Any repository: 12 months embargo

- We deposit in PMC on behalf of the author
- All this is paid for in the subscription fee










Market-Growth in Gold Open Access articles

 - Facilitates distribution, free reuse and sharing for commercial and non-commercial purposes as long as the author and source is attributed
 - Enables self-archiving of the final published version (no embargo restrictions)

What is Gold Open Access at Springer



- Author retains copyright
- User rights under CC-BY 4.0 International Creative Commons Attribution license
- Deposit anywhere using SWORD protocol (for Springer Open Choice TBD)
- Deposit in Portico/CLOCKSS, KB (Dutch National Library) and CAS
- Altmetrics
- Indexing and Abstracting in all relevant services
- And all future services to be developed



Open Access and the Big Deal

- So far avoid double dipping by adjusting the list prices
- Since many deals do not use list prices Springer now takes the open choice articles completely out of the equation:
 - Traditional Big Deal is for subscription articles only
 - Full open access is outside the traditional Big Deal

Springer understands the budgetary issues for libraries, especially in countries with a strong uptake of gold open access and is willing to discuss this with the customers







Article level metrics

- alternative to the impact factor, h-index
- Additional to citation counts it measures other aspects of impact like
 - Social media attention
 - Attention in news media
 - Downloads, article views



Springer sees this as a valuable additional metric.




The Finch recommendations: preference for gold open access

- Mixed economy for the foreseeable future
- Policy direction should be towards gold (APC driven) access
- Too short embargoes could harm the existing system unnecessarily
- Also underlying data should be easily accessible
- (Limited) money is made available to engage the process
- Since gold open access is just for the UK produced articles (6% of global output)
 further licensing opportunities need to be considered
